Saint Philomena

Patroness of the Children of Mary

Devotion to this little known saint only began upon discovery of her remains in the Catacomb of St. Pricilla in Rome in 1802. Believed to be a Greek princess in the years 291-304, her parents offered their 13 year old daughter to Emperor Diocletian as a symbol of peace. Refusing his advances and proposal of marriage and honoring her vow of consecrated virginity, Diocletian tortured and killed her.

Upon her relics becoming enshrined, miracles began to happen and since then, she has become another reliable patron of hopeless and impossible cases, with powerful intercessions! Although removed from the Catholic Saint Calendar, Saint Philomena's principle feast day is August 11th.

St. Philomena, powerful with God, pray for us!
