

AROUND OUR (WEST DANE) VICARIATE Let The Bells Ring Bells have been part of

the sounds of humanity since the Neolithic Period. As a far-reaching sound, they have historically been used as a call to arms, to

warn, to work, to pray, to celebrate, to mourn. * Aaron is described as having bells on the hem of his garment. As High Priest, his location was known by the sound of his bells. *Exodus* 28:33-35 * Bells were a sound believed to be 'Holy to the Lord.' *Zechariah* 14:20

* 'Make a joyful noise to the Lord' *Psalm 100:1* In early Christianity, the sound of bells had celestial implications and announced angels present in order to drive out demons. Bells were so prevalent by the New Testament time that St. Paul wrote about speaking with love or you would be just a noisy gong or clanging cymbal *1 Corinthians 13:1* * Bells were introduced to the exteriors of the Church around the year 400 AD, as a call to mass, to prayer, to mourn. Sanctus bells had significance during Mass to let the congregation know when the Consecration was occurring due to visual or language barriers preventing understanding of the exact moment of the event.

* Bells in groups of 3, practiced by many faiths are typically a summons to prayer.

* Bells take many shapes and forms today, with a myriad of additional meanings being used within the secular world. Perhaps the sound of a bell still resonates in your heart as Holy and significant.

Compassionate Support includes a support person to talk to, connection to spiritual counsel, and further follow-up assistance.
