## LEADERSHIP NCCW Resolutions!

In March we talked about the importance of devotion to the Blessed Mother Mary and a daily rosary. This was a resolution passed by NCCW in August 2023. A second resolution was "Belief in the Real Presence", to foster increased understanding of the Church's teaching on Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist. The Bishops of the United States have called for a three-year Eucharistic Revival. The Diocese of Madison's part of this plan is the "Into the Deep" program.
