A MONTH FOR MARY

This year, woven amid the month's Solemnities, Feasts, and Memorials including Ascension of the Lord, Pentecost Sunday and The Most Holy Trinity are days to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary.

May 13th: Our Lady of Fatima. In 1917 between May and October, our Lady appeared to 3 shepherd children each month on the 13th encouraging them to pray and left them with 3 secret messages. May 20th: The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. Mary was officially declared the 'Mother of the Church' in 1964, but early in Christianity, Mary's presence at the foot of the cross of Jesus entrusted her to the disciple whom he loved with the words: "Woman, behold your son". St. John, the other apostles, and Mary gathered in the Upper Room awaiting the descent of the Holy Spirit - the birth of the Church.

May 31st: The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This feast day commemorates the Virgin Mary's visit to her cousin, Elizabeth in the hill country of Judea. Mary, newly pregnant received news from the Angel Gabriel that her cousin Elizabeth was 6 months pregnant. John the Baptist
