St James, Madison, has graciously offered to be the host site for our MDCCW Conference/Gathering on Tuesday, June 18, so we can have a central location.

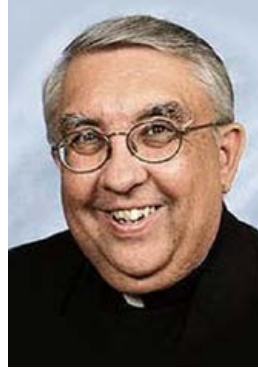

## About the Speakers

### His Excellency Bishop J. Hying, Bishop of Madison



The youngest of six sons, Bishop Donald J. Hying was born in West Allis. He attended St. Aloysius and Immaculate Heart of Mary grade schools, and Brookfield Central High School. Bishop Hying received his bachelor's degree from Marquette University and his master's degree from St. Francis Seminary.

Ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee on May 20, 1989, Bishop

Hying served in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee in difference parishes, before and after traveling to the Dominican Republic to serve as a missionary in Sabana Yegua.

On May 26, 2011, His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI appointed Fr. Hying as Titular Bishop of *Regiae* and Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. On Nov. 24, 2014, His Holiness Pope Francis appointed Bishop Hying as fourth bishop of Gary, IN. On April 25, 2019, Pope Francis named Bishop Hying as the fifth Bishop of the Madison Diocese.

Bishop Hying is a member of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities; the Committee on Laity, Marriage, Family Life, & Youth; and the Committee on Catholic Education. He is a member of the boards of directors for Catholic Relief Services and Relevant Radio and is the chairs the Institute on Religious Life Board as well as the St. Paul Evangelization Society.

Bishop Hying will speak about the Eucharist. In a Catholic Herald article (Sept. 20, 2023), Bishop Hying said, "The Eucharist is the holy means by which our Lord Jesus Christ lives and acts in the world, abiding within each of us. When we embrace a Eucharistic life, grounded in Christ, acting as He does in this sacrament, we become extensions of Him to others. This truth is the fundamental meaning of every vocation and apostolate in the Church."

## Anne Auger,

### Director of Evangelization for St. Therese of Lisieux-Pastorate XVI



Anne Auger, a wife and mother of six children, will revive our interest in the Eucharist by sharing with us: **“Is The Eucharist Really God”?**

Anne earned a master’s degree in theology from Franciscan University of Steubenville in 2003 and has worked extensively in RCIA, Adult Catechesis, and Religious Education programs throughout the Milwaukee and Madison arch/dioceses.

She served as an instructor at the Seat of Wisdom Institute in Madison and has been a keynote speaker at many parishes and Catholic events. She currently lives in Jefferson and serves as the director of evangelization for St. Therese of Lisieux-Pastorate XVI which includes Lake Mills/Johnson Creek, Sullivan, and Watertown’s St. Bernard and St. Henry parishes. Anne’s husband, Peter Auger, was featured recently in The Catholic Herald for his work restoring religious statues and paintings.

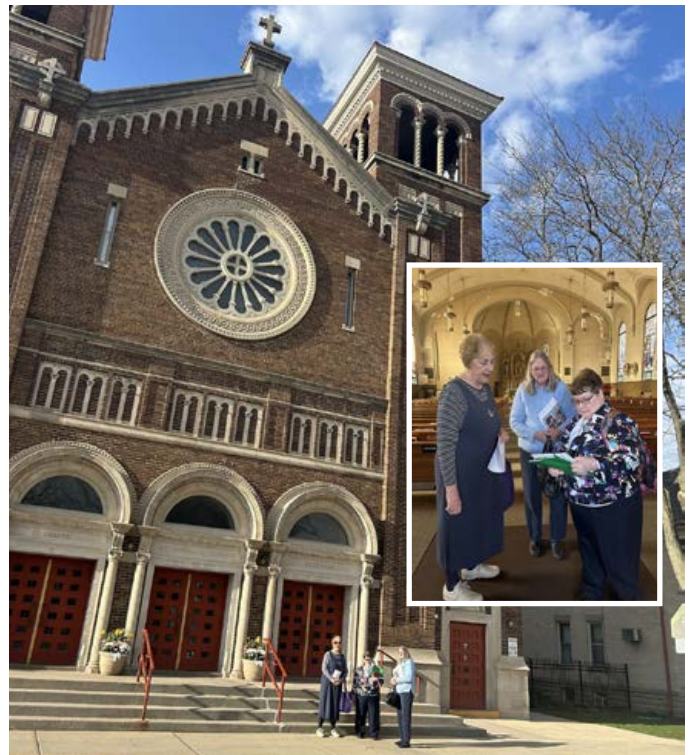
